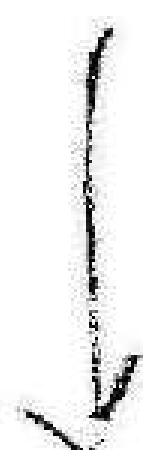

He was an army veteran of World War I. Kerber was awarded the silver star and purple heart for his service in Europe.

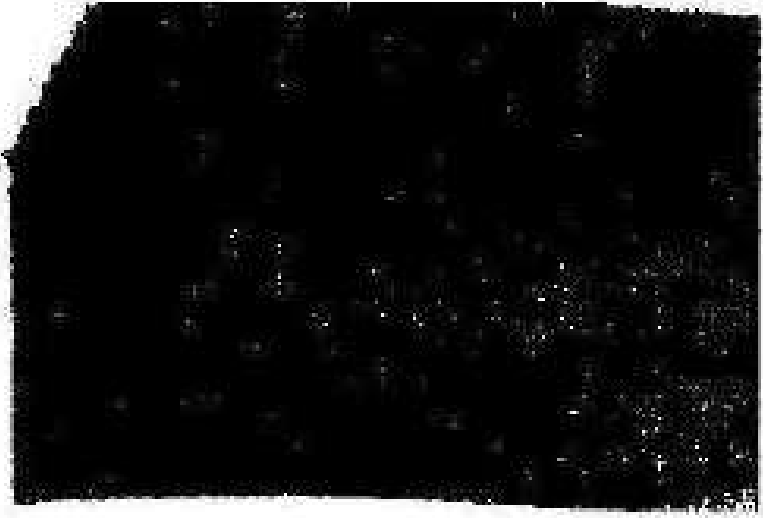
He was a member of the Eagles Lodge No. 39.

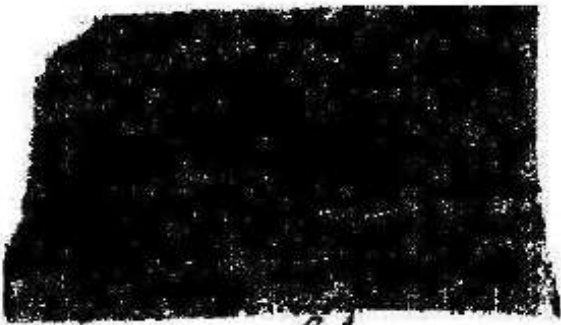
Kerber is survived by three brothers, George and Edward

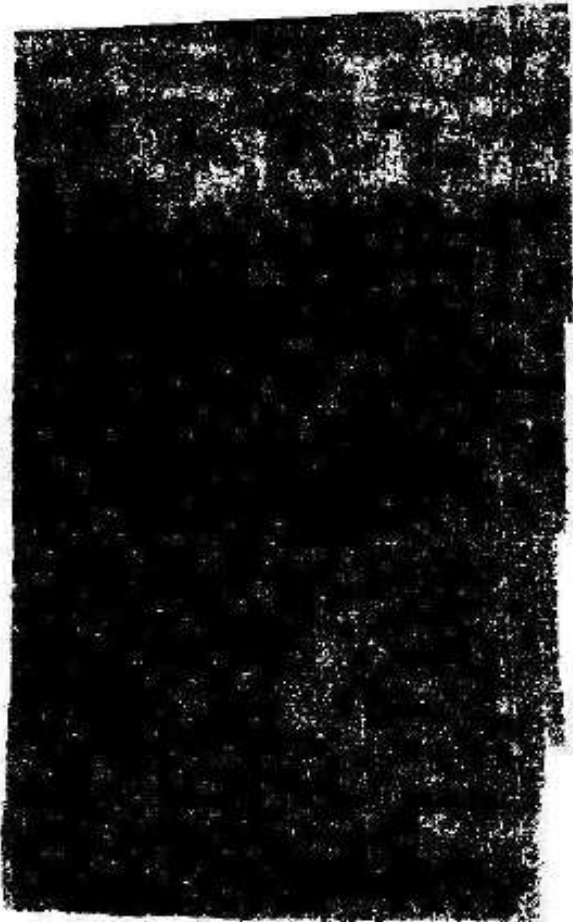
