## HUMBOLDT COUNTY.

THIS county is situated in the northwestern part of the State, there being but one county, Del Norte, intervening between Humboldt and the State of Oregon. It is bounded on the north by Del Norte and Siskiyou Counties, on the east by Trinity, on the south by Mendocino, and on the west by the Pacific Ocean. In its measurement from north to south it covers nearly two parallels of latitude, its southern boundary being the Fortieth parallel, while its northernmost extremity reaches far up toward the Forty-second, the exact distance being about 105 miles, the width being about 40 miles. The superficial area contained average within its boundaries is 3,590 square miles or 2,297,600 acres, an area so immense that a better appreciation of its dimensions is had when it is stated, that Humboldt County is three times as large as the State of Rhode Island, and about as large as the State of Connecticut. In length of coast line it leads the list of all the coast counties, possessing as it does 175 miles of water front. Included in this long line, and situated at about its centre, is found the magnificent Humboldt Bay, the largest and finest harbor on the coast next to San Francisco. It is fifteen miles in length and varies in width from three to seven miles, the total tidal area being about 50 square miles, the entrance is about one mile in width. The navigable channel at the mouth is restricted, however, to a width of a little over one quarter of a mile by breakers which put out from either shore; the depth of water in the channel at low tide is 18 feet. This contraction of the open channel at the mouth of the harbor, enforces the exercise of caution and good seamanship in making an entrance, but once in, perfect security is obtained from all winds and storms. The Government has expended, and is still expending considerable sums in improving the mouth of the harbor, and, with a little additional work, every material impediment to the future of this grand haven will be removed. Trinidad Bay, 17 miles north of Humboldt, is a small deep harbor well sheltered from all winds. Shelter Cove, at the extreme southern part of the coast line, completes the list of ports of the county. It is, however, an available port only in fair weather.

By its topographical features Humboldt County may be classed as entirely mountainous, the entire area being bisected and intersected by the numerous spurs of the Coast Range, which leave the main chain located along the eastern boundary of the county. Unlike many, and indeed a large proportion of the other mountainous portions of the State, in Humboldt no barren crests are found in even her loftiest ranges. Every peak bristles with timber and the slopes hold unlimited wealth of lumber in the gigantic forests found throughout and over all her ranges. This fact naturally causes the lumber industry to represent the one grand salient feature of the county's prosperity. Of the entire acreage of the county the timber lands take up over 1,200,000 acres, of which over 450,000 is redwood proper, with a productive capacity of over 100,000 feet per acre. The remaining timber land may be said to be fairly divided between pine, fir, spruce, cedar, madrone, black, white and live oak, and laurel. A realizing sense of the wealth contained in these enormous figures is readily obtained by the simple statement that the redwood supply of the county is greater than the entire remaining timber bodies of the States of Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin combined. Engaged in the manufacture of lumber in the county are seventeen saw mills, nearly all of which have shingle and lath mills attached, and there are six mills which are devoted exclusively to the making of shingles. The value of the lumber exported during the past year was \$3,250,000, the quantity being over 70,000,000 feet. Labor in the mills and logging camps in Humboldt is munificently paid, reaching in the mills from \$26 to \$100 per month and found, and in the camps from \$40 to \$125 per month and found.

While the lumber industry is by far the predominating interest of the county, agriculture in the available portions of the county is equally remunerative. At present only about 35,000 acres are cultivated, the remaining portions aside from timber lands being devoted to stock and sheep raising. About all the farming lands at present developed, are found in the country adjacent to Arcata, on the bay for seven miles north of Eureka, and in the Eel River Valley twenty miles south of Eureka. The soil is rich and practically inexhaustible, the yield for oats being from thirty-five to ninety bushels per acre, for barley from thirty to eighty five bushels, for wheat from thirty to sixty bushels, and for potatoes from five to seven tons, the latter item—Humboldt potatoes—have for years been regarded and held as the best known to our California markets.

The moist climate prevailing along the shore always prevents a failure of crops, and whether relying on grain or fruit the Humboldt farmer is assured of a fair return for his labor, even in the seasons when other portions of the State suffer from failure in rain. The

average rainfall is about 32 inches and the mean temperature varies from 40° in January to 58° in July.

The fisheries of the county are gradually growing into importance. The streams of the county from the Klamath River on the north down through the whole list which drain the county, literally swarm with salmon with the first winter rains; halibut and flounders are also taken in quantity, and the export interest in this line promises well in the future.

From the broken character of the county's surface the question of railroad communication has been one of great difficulty, and developments are as yet in their infancy; within the past year, however, the embryotic schemes which have languished for years have crystallized into something like a definite movement, and we have now the assured prospect that within the next two years, railroad connection between San Francisco and Eureka will be unbroken. At present, aside from the various lumber-transportation roads, the Arcata and Mad River, the Eureka and Trinidad, and the Eel River and Eureka Railroads deserve notice. The first named extends from Arcata to the north fork of Mad River, a distance of 12 miles, is equipped for passenger and freight traffic, and is doing a thriving business. The Eureka and Trinidad, to run between these two points, will be finished during the present year. The last, the Eel River and Eureka, is now in process of construction, twenty miles being finished and in operation to Hydesville in the Eel River Valley. It is a broad gauge, solidly constructed and equipped with first-class rolling stock. It passes through a fine agricultural country and taps several valuable and extensive timber belts.

With the continuance of these developments, and the maintenance of the activity which has marked all the business interests of the county during the past two years, Humboldt's march in the line of improvement will soon place her in the front rank of the counties of the State. Already the population has leaped from the figures of the last census, 15,511, up to about 24,000; her export trade for the past year passed the gross aggregate of \$4,000,000, and engaged the cargoes of nearly 500 vessels; her lumber shipments from being, as formerly, a local trade, now seek foreign markets direct, and the ship building interest will continue to grow, until on Humboldt Bay, in some not far distant day, will be located the largest interests of this character in our country.

### Arcata.

This town having post, telegraph, and express offices, is situated at the northern end of Humboldt Bay, fourteen miles distant from Eureka, by land, and seven miles by water. It is the second town in size in the county; enjoys a fine and growing trade from the large farming community in the vicinity of the town, and is the depot of supplies for the gold diggings on Klamath and Trinity Rivers.

Arcata will naturally be the seat of great activity in the organization of mining outfits during the coming year, as it will be the preferred route of parties going to the gold fields of the New River District in northern Trinity.

The location of the town is beyond question as beautiful as could be found on the bay, and fringed with the wood-laws which environ it, it presents an attractive appearance. It is prettily laid out, and substantially built. Among its business establishments are a tannery, two steam saw mills, a shingle mill, a flouring mill, and the ordinary business incident to a place of its size. It has also three churches, three public schools, and a public reading room, and a circulating library. Its hotel accommodations are good. The Union Hotel, kept by Jacob Richert being worthy of special note. The population of the town is about 1,500. Direct steamer communication is maintained with San Francisco.

The site is an eligible one easily susceptible of drainage, and affords ample room for expansion. The city is distant from San Francisco 228 miles, with which city it is connected by steamer twice a week, and by overland stage and railroad, via. Cloverdale. The city is well laid out, with broad streets, ample wharves and water front. It is lighted with gas, and possesses an excellent system of water works. The church facilities are ample, and the various organizations are well sustained. The schools are justly the pride of the citizens, and the corps of teachers are as efficient as can be found in any city of the State.

In its newspaper advantages Eureka is represented by two bright and enterprising sheets, one the *Democratic Standard* (weekly) and the other the *Times-Telephone* (daily and weekly). 




