1917-1918

The United States entered the Great European War, or World War I as it was later known, on April 6, 1917. Prior to that date the *Fort Bragg Advocate* carried relatively little information about the war and its battles. A few local men went off to Canada to enlist in the army, but the great numbers of European nationals that worked in the Mendocino County woods, were little affected until America entered the war. Recognizing that volunteers for military service could not provide the numbers of men needed, the Government instituted a draft based on a lottery of registered able bodied men. All eligible men were registered and assigned a number in July 1917. The July 18th newspaper carried the local men's names and numbers. Beginning on July 20, 1917 in Washington, DC, and running for 16½ hours, far into the wee hours of the 21st, 10,499 capsules containing individual numbers on bits of paper were drawn by blindfolded college students to determine the sequence for men to be called to service. The first, #258 and the last #3217, were not held by any Mendocino County men.

The newspaper reported lists of men certified as fit, *i.e.*, passed a physical, called to active duty, registered for the subsequent 1918 draft, failed to return their questionaire (for one reason or another not often reported), listed some as "slackers", and those reporting for duty. Mercifully, casualties were light and largely due to illness or accident both stateside and overseas. Letters from men in the training camps, and later, France, appeared now and again in the paper. Note: The Mendocino County Draft Board went out of business on December 7, 1918.

For convenience to researchers, these lists were merged and presented as a part of the 1910-1919 volume. Comparison with obituary and marriage records, more correct spelling of some individual names was sometimes achieved.

In later years many of these men were active in veterans' organizations in the County, were accorded honors and remembrances in their lives and, after death, were interred in special sections of the cemeteries. Sadly, many of the men who served in France received wounds or suffered illness especially from poison gas attacks that often resulted in shortened lives.

The following material by no means represents any individual's complete service record. These are only names and events as reported in the *Fort Bragg Advocate* during 1917-1918.

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
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INTRODUCTION

THIS VOLUME

This volume is the second in a series chronicling the births, deaths and marriages in one of California's more remote and beautiful counties from 1910 through 1919.

Mendocino County occupies over ninety miles of California's rugged North Pacific Coast. Unpopulated by other than native peoples until 1851, the region's immense stands of giant redwoods attracted several waves of immigration from the rest of the United States, Canada and Europe to work in the woods, sawmills, railroads, ranches and harbors. Many of their activities and achievments were reported by the local newspapers from 1877. The first volume of this series recorded information originally published in the *Fort Bragg Advocate* from its inception in 1889 through 1909. This second volume continues the record through 1919.

THE DECADE

The period covered by this volume probably represents the greatest change in the coastal county's life. The rough and tumble aspect of pioneer life was moderated by the advent of electricity, extension of the telephone network and completion of the railroad that connected (1912) the coast with the rest of the Nation's system. Improvement of education, medical services (the hospital opened 1915), establishment of civic organizations such as a chamber of commerce in Fort Bragg (1915), slow improvement of roads for the growing numbers of automobiles and extension of agriculture were notable. While over 600 sawmills have been identified in Mendocino County from 1852 to the present, logging of the redwoods reached a peak in this period. The greatest impact on the County's history, however, was the World War which called a substantial number of young men to service outside the county and stimulated many others to migrate to the San Francisco Bay area to work in war-related industries.

THE NEWSPAPER

The newspaper accounts collected for this volume came from the *Fort Bragg Advocate* established May 29, 1889 and published continously to date. The publisher, Charles J.Cavanagh, acquired the paper in 1893 and ran it until his death in 1925. A typical country paper of four to six pages, copy was hand set so that birth, death and marriage notices tended to be brief. In the early part of the decade the paper acquired a Linotype machine. That purchase along with low cost newsprint resulted (1912) in an 8 page newspaper with a corresponding expansion of coverage. Birth, death and marriage notices along with news, reports of social events, legal notices, court proceedings, filings with the county recorder, advertising plus items from other local and regional papers expanded to fill the space available. The resulting volume of information included in this publication for a ten year span equaled the previous twenty year period.

THE PEOPLE

The first non-native arrivals to Mendocino County were primarily white Americans who came to California either across the great plains by wagon, horse or on foot or sailed to San Francisco with a land crossing at Panama. The first groups of foreign peoples came first from Canada and then from northern Europe attracted by the lumberjobs in the woods. Finns were a major element before the turn of the century followed by a wave of Portuguese mostly from the Azores. Many of the latter first worked in the Hawaii cane fields before coming to Mendocino County. In the first decade of the twentieth century the principal origin of new immigrants was Italy, primarily from the northern sections. In 1921 the Federal census reported 20% of the county were foreign born with 35 countries represented, Italy and Finland being the largest contributors.

The War

This volume contains a special section listing the names of Mendocino County men serving in World War I. These are listings of Selective Service registrations, calls to physical examinations, results thereof, draft numbers, reported delinquincies, calls to active duty, service performed, *etc.* as reported in the newspaper. A 1927 Roll of the Dead is shown on the final page.

THE DATA AND STYLE

This volume of births, deaths and marriages for the years 1910 through 1919 is similar to Volume One. Some of the news items were edited to provide a normal presentation of information; minor extraneous material was deleted.

As in the earlier work children and women's names are often lacking. Birth announcements usually mention the father's name, rarely the mother's and seldom the child's. The death of a child, especially before the age of twelve, was announced as the child of the father. Women's death notices rarely mentioned the deceased's maiden name; only their married name was reported, *i.e.* Mrs. A.B. Smith, wife of A.B. Smith, or, sometimes, Mrs. Anna Smith. Fortunately, marriage records often gave the bride's maiden surname. Yet, a change is to seen in this decade. As the reportage expanded, death notices began to include names of survivors, their residences, circumstances of death, some personal attributes, place of burial, and officiating clergy. The marriage notices also expanded to include parents' names, relatives, location and date of ceremony and officiating judge or clergy.

The spelling of names are generally shown as printed with obvious errors corrected. Many immigrants anglicized their names on arrival in the United States or, if retaining their native spellings, came up with a great variety of different combinations. Children often changed their names when first attending school as foreign spellings and strange vowel combinations sometimes complicated their acceptance. The publisher of the newspaper set down a wide range of strange name spellings in his newspaper and little attempt has been made to correct or change his product.

THE MENDOCINO COAST GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

The Mendocino Coast Genealogical Society, founded in 1976, has supported and sponsored the production of this book as a community project to record the local history of Fort Bragg's pioneer settlers and their descendants. The assistance and enthusiasm of the publisher and staff of the *Fort Bragg Advocate-News*, successor to the *Fort Bragg Advocate*, is gratefully acknowledged and deeply appreciated by the Society's researchers.
