

THE NAPA VALLEY GENEALOGICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY

The Society was founded by Marian E. McGuire in July of 1974 as an offshoot of the Napa County Bicentennial Commission. There were 135 charter members by the first membership meeting in January 1975 and the Society has grown rapidly to its present status of a highly respected educational organization. Incorporation as a non-profit organization was accomplished in June of that same year.

In March 1975 the doors to our library were opened. Those using our facility found it housed in just one small room, with a few shelves of books. As our membership increased and we were financially able to purchase books (or they were donated or loaned), more space was needed, and we acquired the use of two additional rooms. Our holdings are now over 4000 volumes -- and still growing.

Instructional classes are offered in beginning genealogical research, as well as clinics for specialized help and regional study groups. Our meetings are of a very high caliber, with timely, interesting, informative topics, from which we all benefit. The Society's highly successful annual "Roots and Shoots" seminars were begun in 1978, bringing to the area the very finest genealogical teachers and lecturers.

Objectives of the Society

- 1. To promote interest in genealogical and related historical and biographical research.
- To provide instruction in research techniques involving evidence, proof and documentation stressing accuracy and ethics.
- 3. To accumulate and preserve manuscripts, documents, records, family histories and other genealogical holdings through the establishment of a genealogical library.
- 4. To serve as a medium for sharing knowledge and educational and social activities.
- 5. To encourage compilation and publication of records, family histories and biographies.

LIBRARY RESEARCH

Genealogists must of necessity shop around to find access to special materials needed to document and prove lineage at those sticky times when all usual searches are fruitless. Genealogical libraries vary considerably because they must consist of old, rare and out of print genealogies, histories, documents and records. Libraries are today becoming very sophisticated with the widespread use of microfilm, microfiche and taped oral materials. Now the prospect of massive computer banks of genealogical data adds a new dimension. Reprints of expired copyright materials are expanding access to information otherwise inaccessible. However, cost is always a big factor and newer libraries must always strive to obtain the basics for the greatest numbers of users. Bequests and gifts often determine the strength of materials in various particular areas. Older libraries such as Sutro and California Genealogical Library have old collections and great strength in the Colonial area, New England, and the Southeast and large holdings for most of the states and some other countries. Many new accessions keep these libraries very useful. Professional librarians also give aid and counsel. Both have a large number of family and local histories and periodicals from many areas. Census indexes are extremely useful in placing a family in a locale at a known date. From this knowledge, local records, histories, land records, plat maps, newspapers and biographies often bridge the generation gap.

Proper use of the card catalog is a <u>must</u> and one must consult subject, title, author, location or family name, as needed. Complete number, title and author and page number should be noted for ease in finding and can be used for footnote documentation. For a geographical area look first under country (e.g. USA or England), then state or shire, then county or parish. Then look alphabetically for towns, church records, court, land, probate, vital records, etc. Bibliographies and published indexes should be consulted to find compiled genealogies, local and family histories. Look under general surname and also allied family names. Search areas of known localities where the surname is predominent, as indicated by census index. A letter to the local or county library where the ancestor lived often brings information not available elsewhere.

I found the State Papers for North Carolina and South Carolina particularly useful.

Bancroft Library on U. C. Berkeley Campus and the California Historical Society Library, 2099 Pacific Avenue, San Francisco, and California State Library in Sacramento are recommended for California research.

A subsequent article will outline holdings of the Napa Valley Genealogical and Biographical Library and explain use of our rare books. We are very proud to have 35 of the 38 original volumes of the American State Papers, 1778 - 1832, and recommend the use of the volumes on Public Lands and Claims.

SCOTT FAMILY STORY

Great grandmother, Roxanna Jane (Clark) was a noted practical joker. This story about her is a favorite of her descendants.

Jane Scott, as she was called, was active in the Methodist Church. When a visiting minister would come to her area in Cooke County, Texas, she always had room for him, and not only gave him bed and board, but saw that he had a clean shirt, and handkerchief for his "preaching."

One of the preachers was very anti-tobacco, especially chewing tobacco. He became highly emotional when preaching against that evil. He would become very hot and bothered, and would take out his handkerchief to wipe his brow at a high point in his tirade.

The Sunday morning of our story, the preacher broke into his regular sermon to talk against tobacco. True to form he became hot and pulled out his handkerchief to wipe his brow. Out of his pocket flew two chomps of chewing tobacco, and rolled into the aisle. The preacher fixed a heavy look on great grandmother, and said , "You did that, Mrs. Scott!"--and went on with his preaching....

JOHN KEAN OBITUARY

"DEATH OF JOHN KEAN. AN HONEST AND UPRIGHT MAN CROSSES THE OTHER SIDE."

"On Saturday night last, at his residence in this city, John Kean, Assessor of Napa county, breathed his last. His sickness was of short duration, but was not unexpected, as the malady was a severe case of pneumonia which he had contracted.

"John Kean's death will be a loss to Napa county and to the whole community. He was a loving and devoted father, and kind husband and a faithful friend. He was an honest, upright man in all his dealings, and he died loved and respected by all who knew him.

"John Kean was born in Granville, Licking county, Ohio, April 29th, He resided there until he was six years of age, when with his parents 1833. he moved to Finlay. Hancock county, where he resided for four years. When he was ten years of age they moved to the adjoining county. Putnam, where he remained until he came to California. In that county he received his education at the common schools. When quite young he learned the cabinetmaker's trade from his father, following it, and going to school until March, 1852, when he, with his father, proceeded to Fayette, Missouri, where they procured a team and supplies and left Independence, same State, May 2d, 1852, to cross the plains for the Golden State, coming by way of Salt Lake City. When on the Platte river his father on June 4th was attacked with the cholera and died. Mr. Kean continued his journey to the Far West, entering the State at Placerville in September, 1852, and arrived at Sacramento the 29th of the same month. He immediately began ranching on Cache creek, Yolo county, in which he continued until the Spring of 1858. He then removed to Coyote valley, then a part of Napa county, but now in Lake county, and there began the business of ranching and continued in this for two years. He removed from there in 1860 to Pope valley, Napa county, where he erected a saw mill, and in connection with it carried on farming until 1867. In that year he was appointed Deputy Assessor by B. W. Arnold and served until 1868. when, by J. H. Howland, he was appointed to the office of Deputy County Recorder, and held this position until 1869. He was in that year appointed to the office of Superintendent of the County Infirmary, which position he held two and one-half years. In 1871-2 he was once more appointed to the office of Deputy Assessor under B. W. Arnold and served two years. Again, in 1873-4, he was appointed to the position of Deputy County Clerk and Recorder by C. B. Seeley. In 1875 he was nominated and elected to the office of City Clerk and Treasurer of Napa City, which position he held one year, and was then elected County Assessor. He held this important office for ten years, and most faithfully and satisfactorily did he perform the duties thereof.

"Mr. Kean leaves to mourn his untimely death a wife and four children -one son and three daughters. The children are Leslie G., Mary L., Maud and Zoe, aged respectively, 17, 15, 12, and 8.

"Deceased was a member of several secret orders -- the Knights of Pythias, A.O.U.W., and Chosen Friends. He was also a member of the Petaluma Relief Association. 7

"The funeral was held from the Presbyterian church at 2 o'clock Monday. The sermon was preached by Rev. Richard Wylie. A long procession followed the body to its last resting place in Tulocay, where the beautiful service of the Knights of Pythias was conducted at the grave."

FRENCH FAMILY LETTER

JAMES ISLAND, South Carolina

Novm 6th 1864.

Dear Marey I recied your kind and welcom letter of the 30th day before yesterday. Lieut Pierce brought the box and all of the things safe that you sent me my vest and all and was thankfuley recied

the bread was all sound and good and you cant imagin how good your cooking tasted to me I am now in good health and hope this may reach you and your dear little familey in the injoyment of the same blessings of life the health of our men is jeneraly good I havent much news and times is all quiet here now and the weather is find I will now tell you about our new recruits our old Majour has taken one hundred and fifty of the yank Preisners into our Batt and 25 is in our company They are men that has taken the oath so you see that we are now fighting with men that has bin fighting against us and I have no confidence in them and doant like to be put with yankeys they just joined our side to get our of Prison 1 know they are still in favour of the north I will write to you in my next letter how I like our new companions but they are a bad looking set of men generaly and filthey I want you write me whear you expect to live next year if you have made aney arangements yet and if you havent you had better make arrangements as soon as you can before it gets too late Also write whether you have hoggs enough to make meat to do you or not and how you make out about salt a good maney of our men are coming in but we doant git maney furlows you may still send my cloaths if you git the chance perhaps Jim Brooks will come back and if he does you can send them by him i want you write to me whether you need aney money or not if you need aney I will send you some I could spend it all and ten times more but it would do me but little good and I think it will all soon be worthless. Nothing more at this time onley I remain your loving husband until death



WASHINGTON'S ROOTS

Los Angeles--George Washington, the "father" of our country, may have been a descendant of the Vikings, who many believe discovered America long before Columbus.

So reported Dr. Reidar Sognnaes, UCLA professor of oral biology and anatomy, at the ninth International Association of Forensic Sciences Congress in Bergen, Norway held last June.

Sognnaes is internationally known for his study of Washington's dental roots. He has documented the first president's dental problems and produced replicas of his dentures from museum and private collections.

Recently, the UCLA professor conducted a preliminary investigation of Washington's genealogical roots. Washington's family origin might be traced to the town of Voss in Norway (better known to many Americans as the birthplace of legendary Notre Dame Coach, Knute Rockne). If so, the president's ancestor--a Viking son of a Vossing--crossed the Norse Sea, landed in England and with a Norwegian accent identified himself by the name of Vossingson.

Thus, Vossingson could have become Washington, the UCLA researcher pointed out.

The title of Sognnaes' presentation at the Bergen meeting was "George Washington's Roots--the Case of a Double Presidential Cover-up."

"President Washington was secretive when it came to the identification of his roots, both dental and parental," Sognnaes said. He had many dental appointments, but admonished his aid not to "make a parade of it." He even camouflaged one of his dental bills by paying a hat bill for his dentist.

On one occasion before he became president, Washington did refer to his Viking roots. Before the Societas Scandinavians in Philadelphia in 1782 he said he was "glad and proud he was of Norse descent."

Presumably he learned this through his grandmother, Mildred Warner, who, like William the Conqueror, has been traced to Viking ancestry from the earldoms of the fjord region of western Norway. The family has also been traced by genealogist Carl M. Gunderson of West Los Angeles back to Harold the Fairhaired, who in 872 united Norway under one kingdom.

Perhaps it was not a matter of secrecy to Washington as much as uncertainty, Sognnaes said. This was a new world; the past was but a prologue.


