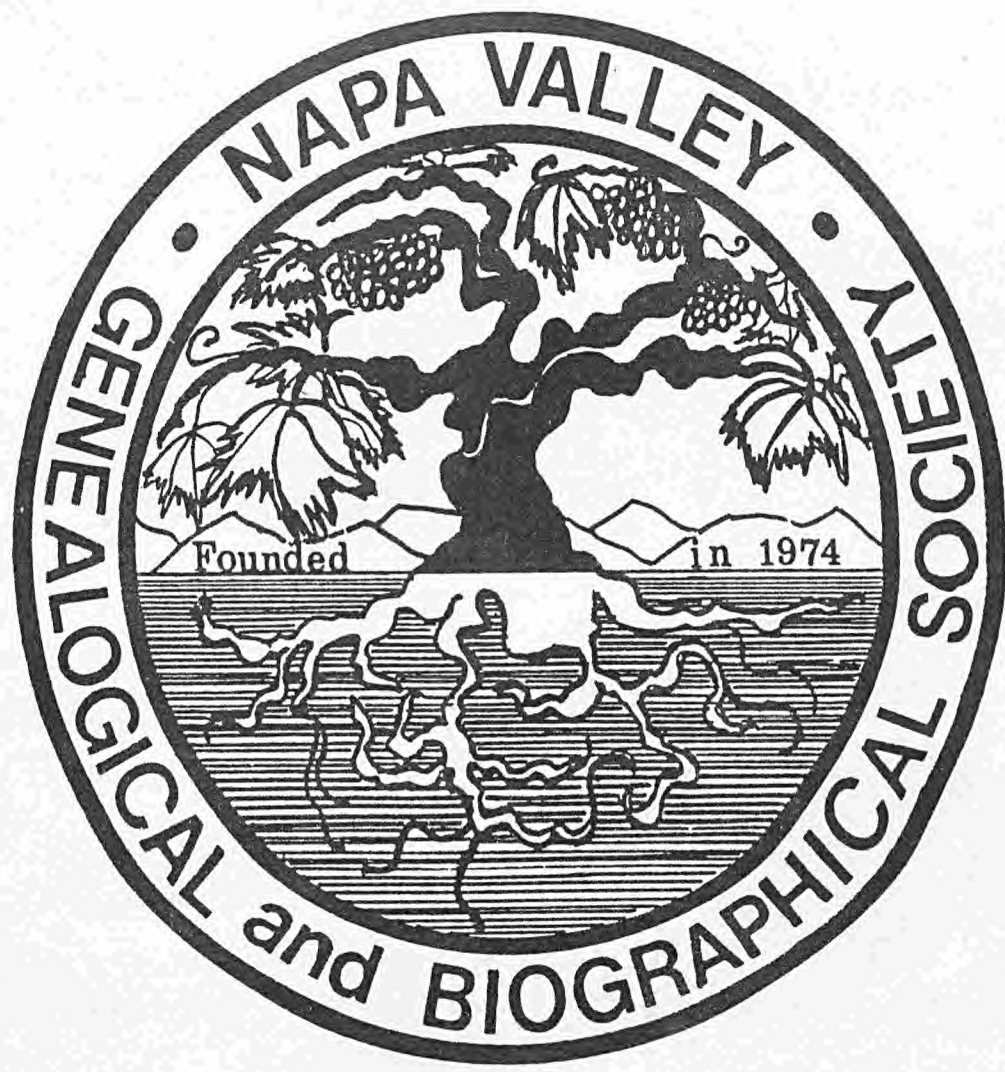

THE NAPA VALLEY GENEALOGICAL AND BIOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY

The Society was founded by Marian E. McGuire in July of 1974 as an offshoot of the Napa County Bicentennial Commission. There were 135 charter members by the first membership meeting in January 1975 and the Society has grown rapidly to its present status of a highly respected educational organization. Incorporation as a non-profit organization was accomplished in June of that same year.

In March 1975 the doors to our library were opened. Those using our facility found it housed in just one small room, with a few shelves of books. As our membership increased and we were financially able to purchase books (or they were donated or loaned), more space was needed, and we acquired the use of two additional rooms. Our holdings are now over 4000 volumes -- and still growing.

Instructional classes are offered in beginning genealogical research, as well as clinics for specialized help and regional study groups. Our meetings are of a very high caliber, with timely, interesting, informative topics, from which we all benefit. The Society's highly successful annual "Roots and Shoots" seminars were begun in 1978, bringing to the area the very finest genealogical teachers and lecturers.

Objectives of the Society

1. To promote interest in genealogical and related historical and biographical research.
2. To provide instruction in research techniques involving evidence, proof and documentation stressing accuracy and ethics.
3. To accumulate and preserve manuscripts, documents, records, family histories and other genealogical holdings through the establishment of a genealogical library.
4. To serve as a medium for sharing knowledge and educational and social activities.
5. To encourage compilation and publication of records, family histories and biographies.

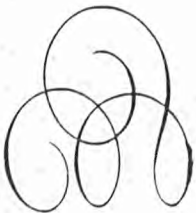
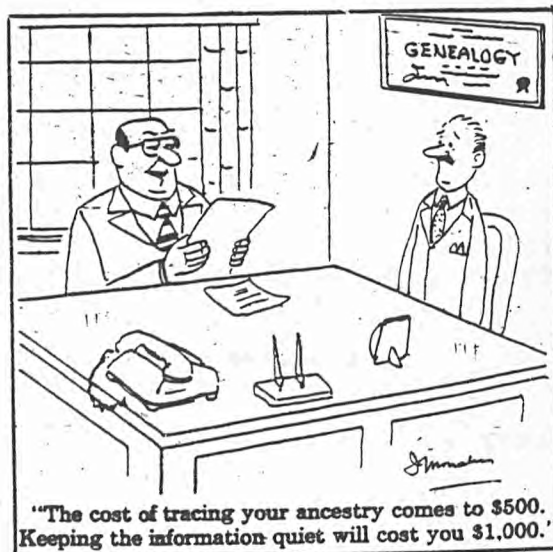

A new quarterly is being published specifically designed to cover Lancaster County PA before and after its establishment in 1729 titled Lancaster County Connections. It is written by genealogists for genealogists. It will cover the many ethnic backgrounds which helped to make up the county - Pennsylvania Germans, Scotch-Irish, English, Jews, Negroes and other groups. Articles on Presbyterians, Lutherans, Reformed, Quakers, Roman Catholics, Church of the Brethren, Mennonites and Amish will be included. Material will be extracted from original documents and hard-to-get older publications and provided in serial form -- much of it for the first time. Also indexed listings of individuals mentioned in the many old records available in the various Lancaster County archives and libraries. Continuous columns by noted Lancaster County authorities, tips, hints and general information on searching by knowledgeable librarians, abstracted data from old wills, and information from subscribers, queries, bible records, wanted column, manuscripts, and much more. Ten years ago the Public Archives of Canada established NATIONAL ETHNIC ARCHIVES to preserve all types of archival documents from the various Canadian ethnic groups and to record their heritage. -- Many immigrants who came from Germany and the former Austrian-Hungarian Empire arrived in the new world via Canada. -- The Polish Genealogical Society Newsletter reports on the collection of the POLISH ARCHIVES PROGRAM. There are, for example, over 10,000 files from the papers of the Russian Consuls in Canada on immigrants from the former Russian Empire, including many files on immigrants from Polish lands. Also, during World

War I, many recent Polish immigrants were obliged to receive identification documents from the Russian Consuls so that they would not be interned as citizens of Austria-Hungary or Germany. As a result there are many files on individual Polish immigrants. -- The Polish Archives Program invites inquiries from potential donors who are interested in donating archival material to the Public Archives. RESEARCHING SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

One set of records that may not have occurred to researchers to be of any genealogical value is the Social Security files. The Social Security Account Number (SSAN) is divided into 3 sets of figures. The 3 digits in the first group show the state where the number was issued ("Issued" not necessarily where the applicant was living at the time of application.) The second group of numbers contains 2 digits, used to define people within that state. The third group, containing 4 digits, is a listing in numerical sequence, to determine the total number of applicants. An applicant listed where he was living when he applied; his date and place of birth; his father's name and his mother's maiden name. A call to the local Social Security office confirms that it is possible to obtain copies of the applications; they will outline the procedure for you. Searching for a maiden name? Speaker Barbara Hill, at our August meeting, gave us the following sources as possibilities:

1. Death certificates if within the past 100 years.
 2. If more than 100 years, her children's death certificates.
 3. Newspaper obituaries.
 4. Her children's marriage certificates.
 5. Published church records - found in libraries.
 6. Unpublished records--microfilmed at branch L.D.S. libraries.
 7. International genealogical index - microfiche - L.D.S. libraries.
 8. Divorce papers from county courthouse where filed.
 9. Records from burned courthouses and churches no longer existing - local newspaper indexes - book: NEWSPAPER INDEXES authored by Anita Cheek Milner
 10. County histories - biographies of individuals and their families.
 11. Military pension information, widow's affidavits, bounty land warrant records - National Archives.
 12. Local published family genealogies, bibliographies in book form.
 13. SURVEY OF AMERICAN GENEALOGICAL PERIODICALS INDEXES, by Kip Sperry - also state and local historical society quarterlies and monthlies-indexes.
 14. Do a will search. Write local historical societies (SASE) - inquire for index of wills. Salt Lake City has microfilm probate files, but this is a lengthy search.
 15. Send queries to publications like the Genealogical Helper, Historical/Genealogical Society quarterlies, the Tri-State Trader, etc. The weekly newspapers of your ancestor's small towns will often take queries too.
 16. Deed indexes of the 17th and 18th centuries - other land records.
 17. Censuses sometimes mention the mother-in-law.

The following has been excerpted from a news release from Gladys Hansen, City Archivist, San Francisco, CA:

"On April 18, 1906, an earthquake measuring 8.25 on the Richter Scale rocked San Francisco. The quake, lasting 48 seconds, and the subsequent fire, lasting three days and nights, caused tremendous property damage. The number of casualties, never completely tabulated, was in the hundreds.

To arrive at the accurate total for the number of dead, Mrs. Gladys Hansen, San Francisco City Archivist, has made a thorough search of all available records. Her total of 826 known dead far exceeds the official figure of 478 given by the 1907 Board of Supervisors. Yet ... Mrs. Hansen believes the revised figure too low. She appeals to anyone having knowledge of any person killed in the 1906 disaster to write her with whatever information they have. The names of the dead will be entered in the official roster in the Public Library, available to researchers of history & genealogy."

M O N T A N A R E S E A R C H

The following article appeared in Vol. 2 No. 12 of the San Mateo County Genealogical Society Newsletter and was compiled by their member Margaret McKinnie.

WHERE TO WRITE

1. The County Clerk and Recorder of every county has birth, marriages, death, registered voters and land records such as homesteads, some as early as 1882. Check with the Handy Book for Genealogists for a complete list.

2. The County Superintendent of Schools has lists of teachers, and school census, age birth to 21 years.

3. The County Clerk of the District Court has court cases and wills.

4. Each county and/or city has a cemetery association. The local morticians are also helpful.

5. The County Historical Society is usually c/o the City Library.

CHURCHES

Roman Catholic - for baptisms and marriages, write to Chancery of Western Mountain Dioceses, Helena Montana 59601 or to Chancery of Eastern Mountain Dioceses, Great Falls, Montana, 59401.

Lutheran - the local Lutheran Church in the town you are researching usually has baptism and confirmation information.

Protestant - some Protestant Churches have letters of transfer so you can tell where the person came from or where they moved.

HISTORIES

Local histories will help a genealogist with migration patterns, the reason for the migration, nationalities, and occupations within the county.

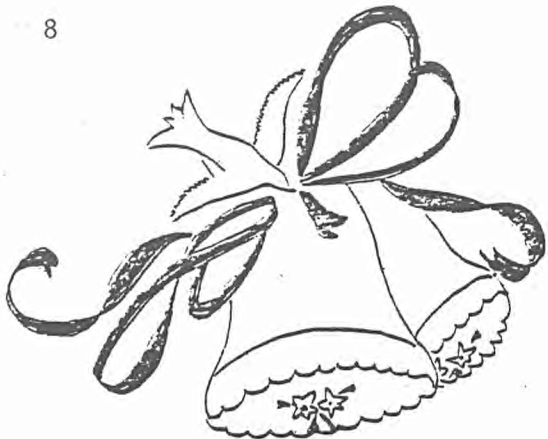

CHAIN OF EVENTS
A Family History

On 16 October 1849, James Bradford Morse set sail for California via Cape Horn on an old converted whaling ship from Nantucket, Massachusetts. His destination -- San Francisco. His journey was the start of a chain of events that, in time, brought my ancestors together in Mendicino County, where my parents met and were married. As will be noted, the late 1870's seem critical to the changing patterns in the lives of these people.

James did not meet my great-grandmother, Sarah Rader Quesenberry, until 1877 when, as a young widow, she was in need of an attorney to settle her deceased husband's estate. Sarah traveled by stage coach to San Francisco from Ukiah. They were married a few months later.

The Charles Rader family had been part of a wagon train heading west from Birmingham, Iowa on 9 April 1863. Ultimately, Sarah and her family settled in Potter Valley, Mendicino County, California. The links in the chain were beginning to come together.

Somewhere around 1850, Thomas McFarland came west from Ohio - probably Harrison or Jefferson County. By 1860, he was married to Nancy Owens, living in Sebastopol (later Yountville) in Napa County, with two small children. By 1870, he and Nancy had moved to Healdsburg, Sonoma County with their six children, and my grandfather, James, was a year old.

James' future bride, Elizabeth Elyse Morse, was born in 1878 in Potter Valley, where her parents came to live after their marriage the year before - and Elizabeth's future husband arrived in Mendicino County with his recently widowed father, Thomas, sometime between 1877 and 1879. James and Elizabeth McFarland had five children, one of them my father, Harold.

Picking up the missing links: Herman Gunderson came to America from Norway in 1877, the same year James Morse met and married Sarah Rader Quesenberry in California. Herman settled in Wisconsin. Thorina Iverson, 19, made the trip alone from Norway in 1884, also coming to Wisconsin, where she and Herman married in 1886. They raised their eight children in Warner, South Dakota.

It wasn't until 1919 that the connecting circumstances began to unfold in South Dakota, bringing the final links together. One daughter, Ruth, moved to California, and wrote home about the wonderful, warm climate. My grandfather, in ill health, needed a change from the cold, difficult mid-west winters. Family friends had moved to Redwood Valley, Mendicino County, and would welcome my grandparents and their youngest daughter, Emma (my mother).

Thus it was that, on a cold, brisk November morning in 1919, Emma, then eleven years old, boarded a train in South Dakota, with her parents, and headed for Redwood Valley, California. The final link fell into place, and became a very personal part of my own family history.

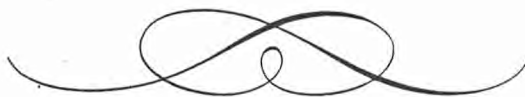

THE GOOD TEMPLAR'S HOME FOR ORPHANS

This home for orphans was open in Vallejo, CA, from 1862 into 1922.

Several years ago I made contact with Sally Woodard, then collecting memorabilia for Vallejo Naval & Historical Museum. The new museum is now open at 734 Marin Street, Vallejo, CA (phone 707-643-1981). Mrs. Dorothy E. Marsden is now researching the Orphan's Home for the museum. She has found an Official Visitor's Register that starts 31 October 1882 and runs into 1903. Also a book of minutes of the organization that starts about 1870. There is also a very short, incomplete list of residents for 1883. Mrs. Marsden stated that the California State Archives in Sacramento has some residents' lists for the years 1883, 1884, 1888 and 1889.

The Good Templars is still a world-wide organization run by a few now-quite-elderly members. It is a temperance organization, as the name suggests. They publish a news bulletin at this address:

"A. POTTERTON FORGOT"

Our ancestors were not all perfect. In fact, some of them "goofed", just as people do today. Here's the sad tale of one who did.

"Terrible Accident" (St. Helena Star) -- "A singular and serious accident occurred Thursday at the home of A. Potterton, on the east side of the valley. Mr. Potterton and his family shortly after dark, detected evidences of a skunk being in close proximity to the house, and the former accompanied by his two boys, took a gun and went out to look for the odoriferous animal. They traced it to the cellar or basement of the house, and Mr. P. seeing the object of his search crouched in one corner, took aim and fired. The shot was followed by a terrible explosion. The whole of one side of the house was blown off and other parts undermined. Mr. Potterton and his two sons, Frank and Willie, were thrown forcibly to the ground and severely burned by the powder. One of the boys was thrown several feet by the force of the concussion. Every particle of hair was burned off from Mr. Potterton's head and face, and the outer skin peeled off. In this horrible condition he walked to town to Dr. Tabor's office where he received attention, and a hack was sent out for the injured boys. They were brought in and both found to be badly burned about the head, hands and legs. Willie, the younger boy, aged 14, had the most serious burn in the palm of the hand. The injuries to all three, while serious and painful, are not necessarily fatal, being merely superficial burns which will in time heal over. The injured parties are now at the St. Helena Hotel, but will be conveyed to their rebuilt home to-morrow. The wife and mother is at their bedside and they are doing as well as could be expected. The singular accident was caused from the fact that a small can of blasting powder was in the cellar, covered with a sack, and the skunk was near the can. Mr. Potterton forgot the powder and shooting at the animal, fired into the can, of course causing the explosion. The skunk was killed."

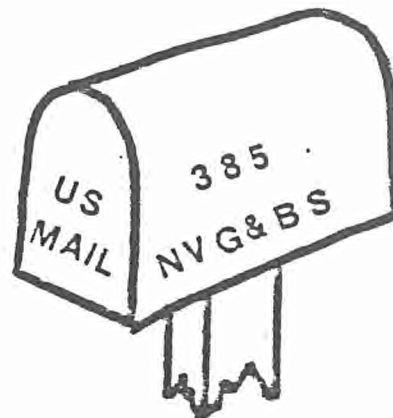

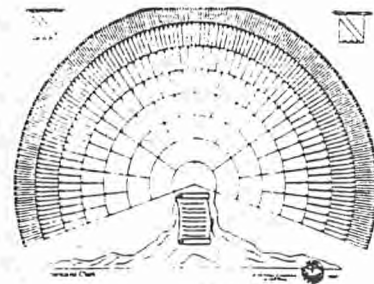
