MISSOURI American Guide Series

TRAILS WEST

- Year 1811 The "Astorians" leave St. Louis for the Columbia River.
- 1815 Organized land trading expedition from St. Louis to Santa Fe.
- 1817 First steam boat arrived at St. Louis (many came thereon boats, then started by wagon train West)
- 1820 First stage coach line starts operating from St. Louis & Franklin
- 1821 Santa Fe Trail opened
- 1826 Kit Carson ran away from home at Franklin to Santa Fe, beginning his career as a hunter, trapper, guide and Indian fighter, then on westward
- 1840 Independence Mo. Main line for wagon trains or out post for the West.
- Kansas City Mo-
- 1848 & 1849 Wagon trains were made up in Kansas City for west
- 1848 Sutter left St. Louis for Cal. and discovered gold-one place said Sutter started from St. Joseph 1849
- 1849 St. Joseph Mo. then became a main starting place for the west



## TRAILS WEST

- 1849 Independence boomed, fitting trains and wagons for the "Gold Rush to Cal."
- 1851 New Santa Fe (town) Trail started for California and Mexico
- 1846 Overland mail Stage Coach from Independence Mo- to Santa Fe.

Scott Valley News, July 21, 1888

Death of Mrs. E. Sterling. Mrs. Eliza Sterling, proprietress of the Sterling House in this place died at about 11 o'clock Tuesday night of Heart disease. Mrs. Sterling had been confined to her room but a few days though long a patient sufferer from the disease which finally ended her life. Her son A. E. Cassidy and daughter Mrs. Irwin, widow of the late ex-Governor Irwin, were telegraphed to come as soon as a fatal termination of her disease was apparent, but it was impossible for them to reach here until too late to see her alive, they arriving only on the evening previous to the funeral which took place on Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, from the M. E. Church. [Eliza Sterling was 68 years of age at the time of her death and had been for about thirty years a resident of this State most of the time living in Siskiyou county. She was universally respected and people came from far and near to attend the last rites of Christian burial. Sympathizing friends share with the relatives]

Letters from Joseph Lane, Governor of the State of Oregon.

Rosenburg, Oregon  
Oregon  
July 17, 1879

Dear Madam:

Your letter of the 21st ult. has been received. I thank you for it, would have answered ere this, but for a press of business that could not be delayed.

I am the grandson of Jesse Lane, one of three brothers mentioned in your letter, who lived near where Raleigh now stands. The three brothers were born near where they lived, away back in Colonial time; were clever, intelligent, old-style gentlemen, and did good service in the War of the Revolution. My Father, John Lane, entered the army while quite young, just in time to be in the battle of Kings Mountain, and remained in the army until the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown. He voted for George Washington the second term, North Carolina having adopted the Constitution after his election, he then voted for John Adams, first and only term, then for Jefferson for two terms, then for Madison, Monroe, Jackson, etc.

My father and uncle, Charles Lane, settled in Buncombe in 1795, where they spent money, time and much labor in an effort to establish iron works near where Asheville now stands, but failed to accomplish their object.

In 1798 my father, then forty years old, married my mother, Elizabeth Street. I am the second son, and was born in Buncombe within four miles of Asheville, on the 14th of December, 1801. In 1804 my father left Buncombe for Henderson County, Kentucky, where I was raised. I married young, raised ten children, six sons and four daughters--all now living but one, a son who died of cholera in New Orleans, in December, 1848. The others are living in this state, all married but one, to wit, Col. John Lane, a graduate of West Point, who resigned at the commencement of the late civil war, joined the southern army, came out at the end of the war badly whipped, and returned to Oregon.

My life has been an eventful one. I was elected to the Legislature of Indiana in 1822, from the counties of Vanderburg and Warwick where I had settled some years before, and continued to serve in the State Legislature off ;and on until '46, when I resigned a seat in the Senate and entered the army, then organized for the war with Mexico; soon raised from the position of private to that of a brigadier, and came out of the service at the close of the war a major general. My first battle, Buena Vista, was under Taylor, then transferred to Scott's line, and saw and helped to fight as many, if not more battles

than any officer of that war. Very soon after peace was made with Mexico, I was, by Mr. Polk, then President, appointed Governor of Oregon Territory and ex-officio Superintendent of Indian Affairs. The trip to be made across the plains in winter, a feat that had not before then been accomplished. But I had at the request of Mr. Polk undertaken the journey and with hurried preparations an escort of twenty men, under Lieut. Hawkins, left Fort Leavenworth, on the tenth day of September, 48, and after a hard struggle arrived at Oregon City on the 2nd day of March, 1849, and on that day issued a proclamation making known that the laws of the United States by act of Congress, had been extended over the territory of Oregon; that I have been duly elected Governor, had taken the oath of office and had entered upon the duties thereof. Well, I continued in office, attended to the ;interest of the good people, also to the Indian affairs, brought the murderers of our people, Chief Tilokite and four of his braves to trial and the gallows, had several fights with different tribes, came near being killed, was badly wounded, placed relations on a good footing with all the tribes, and 1851 was elected delegate to Congress; was four time elected delegate, and then elected one of Oregon's first United States Senators; retired from the Senate in 1861. In 1870, on the sixth of August, my good and beloved wife died. Since than I have lived alone on my ranch in the mountains, 12 miles from this place, until now, I have just finished a very neat little home where I think I shall spend my days unto the end. I am in a quiet part of our town, near some of my children, with whom I shall take my meals and still live alone in my pleasant little home. My son, who represented Lafayette this state, in the forty-fourth Congress, lives near me; he is the youngest of my children, a good lawyer and a kind son.

And now returning to the old family. I visited in 1860, North Carolina, and my father's birthplace, the old home of my grandfather, four miles from Raleigh. In Raleigh I visited the house in which Joel Lane lived at the time he deeded as present to the State 640 acres of land, on which the city now stands; called at the State House where such records are kept, to look at the deed of conveyance; saw many relatives, and spent several days with my cousin, David L. Swain, (Governor then). at Chapel Hill, and learned much about our family, and intended to visit old Buncombe, but did not. Had I carried out my program I might have enjoyed the pleasure of seeing you. (The governor's Sister)

Of my grandfather's family there were eight sons and eight daughters. My aunts married gentlemen named respectively as follows: Rhoda was married to Rakestraw, Patience to John Hart, Rebecca to Luckey, Sallie and Polly to brothers named Kirkpatrick, Winnifred to Rogers, Elizabeth to Parson Montgomery, and your grandmother Carrie married David Lowry. My father, and Uncle John Hart, Matt. Barber and one other gentleman, whose name I forget, and Uncle Lowry, were in pursuit of Indians who had been stealing and robbing the outside

settlers, and--all five were good Indian fighters--ventured too far, were attacked by a large party of warriors. Barber, Lowry and the other, after hard fighting, were killed. My father and Hart made good their escape. Some time after Aunt Carrie married Swain, whose son David L. Swain I had corresponded with for many years before I made his acquaintance at Chapel Hill, as above mentioned. All of the eight sisters were noble, good and true women. I often saw your grandmother, but was too young to remember her. Governor Swain often spoke of her with much love and respect and esteemed her one of the best of mothers and most loveable of women.

The eight sons of my grandfather were named as follows: Charles, Joel, Jonathan, Simon, John, Richard, Joseph and Jesse. Gov. Colquitt of Georgia, is the son of the daughter of my uncle Jo. Lane. I met him in Mexico and served with him in Congress. My grandfather moved from Georgia to Illinois when he was 84 years of age, and killed many buffaloes in that then as now uninhabited country. He died at 88. I know but little of the whereabouts of many of my cousins. They are scattered over the Southern States.

My Dear Cousin

I have had the pleasure of receiving and reading and rereading your interesting letter and thank you for it. You, more than myself, understand the art of committing your thoughts to paper, in an easy and pleasant, forcible and agreeable style, consequently am the more benefited and obliged by the interchange of letters and thoughts than is my dear cousin.

Before proceeding to answer your letter in detail you must allow me to tell you how happy I am at the reformation of my beloved Lafayette. Since the first day of September last past, he has not touched or tasted whisky, his nerves have become steady, his head is clear, his complexion is good, and health restored, and is as bright as of yore. The difference between Lafayette drunk and Lafayette sober is so great and to me so gratifying is the change that I leave you to imagine how glad and thankful I am, and how proud I feel.

I thank you for telling me of my cousin Keziah Sugg. Forget her, no, no, how could I forget so good and so dear a cousin as Mrs. Sugg. her good mother was my father's oldest sister, and well did I know and love your grandmother, Stanley (after.) Jordan, and your aunt Keziah Hart, to know was to love them. Never were a better family of sisters raised by any mother than the Hart sisters. Give my love

to my dear old cousin Sugg. It is now very many years since last I saw her and until receipt of your letter I know not whether she was living or dead. God grant her ease and comfort the balance of the time she has to stay.

Now my dear in regard to the portrait picture of myself taken by the great artist Mr. Cogswell. Is pronounced by all who have seen and closely examined it to be as fine and correct and lifelike a picture as has ever been taken of any living man. Full size standing 3/4 length framed, face fine marks of age, but not a wrinkle, expression manly and selflike, snow white hair natural as life. No man has ever been better taken, not even the great Napoleon who did so much for civilization by teaching mankind to feel contempt for crowned heads that stood but slightly in the way of progress, and who were not as pretended. the anointed and appointed of God to rule, crush and oppress the people. Washington alone did more to elevate and bring mankind to a study of their rights than did Napoleon. But enough. The picture is a grand success, full of lifelike vigor and energy. Background from my old mountain home. Just stepped out of the cabin door, right hand resting upon a grand old granite rock, fit emblem of lasting fame, for ten days at the request of the great artist I sat and talked that he might bring out in full life the expression and animation of one who liked to talk. The picture is good, very good. In regard to it, my dear cousin, be assured.

I am sorry that Mrs. Jackson McClain had to die, but how hard to leave a kind good husband and their five young sons. I would to God that she could have lived, yet many years; the Col. and his boys have my sympathy. May they live long and be happy.

I have read quite a number of the sermons of the great sensation-  
alist preacher Talmadge and can say that I have not a very high  
opinion of one or the other...of Christ it may be truly said that  
he was great and good. It is the innocence of his character, the  
sublimity of his moral precepts and teachings that one cannot but  
admire. But how is one to know that his disciples were not a band  
of dupes and imposters, with Paul as the great chief and as appears  
to me the least worthy of the band. Pardon me, I will say no more.  
I am not a believer in mysteries and miracles. Allthings that on  
earth have been or taken place can be scientifically accounted for  
and explained, one in three and three in one or in other words  
three is one, perils one that has not strong faith. Believe me,  
my dear, I would not for the world say anything to disturb the  
religious faith or opinion of anyone. One great Creator of all  
the worlds and the wonderful system of laws by which all is gov-  
erned is grand and beautiful enough for me. Our own little world  
has existed millions of years. and will continue to make its  
evolutions as heretofore for millions of years to come.

Hancock will be elected, then I would be glad to be there with you that I could in joy hug you and all your family and their friends.

Your letters are of very deep interest to me and to my daughter Emily (Flood), Mary Hogan, her daughter and to Mrs. Lafayette Lane, all three good faithful Catholics and the two last named quite scholarly. They read your letters and ask me to give to you their love and beg that you continue to write that they as well as myself may have the pleasure of reading from your pen. You know that I am proud of you and glad that I am related to you. The same blood to some extent courses through our veins and I have a right to love you and to love to read your letters. And the ladies above named alljoin in kind wishes to you and your family. I am tired and in pain but not done writing, will rest till night and then try and finish this short letter.

I have walked to the busy part of our town, listened to fools and others talk and discuss Garfield and his fitness to be president. Our county for years has been republican, good work for Hancock is being done, whether or not we carry Oregon. We know or think we do that our ticket will be elected and our country will be safe and no more war will take place. Garfield could not bring about another war but we want him not. I had forgot all about cousin Nats boys. I am obliged to your for mentioning them and the daughter that is in N. Y. finishing her education. My love to all of them. It is now twenty years since I met you. Your father and your mother at his house where together we dined. Now my dear, in mind I see you as then you were, a charming, loveable young lady with just the pride and self-respect that so good a girl ought to have. No, no, you will not hereafter be separated from those you love and did love so much and so dearly.

It was my intention to answer your letter fully, but I declare that I am suffering so much in my shoulder and fingers that tonight I cannot and tomorrow I have to go from home for several days, therefore must close and mail in the morning. To your mother, sister and brother give my love, to Col. Jackson McClain, family and other friends, McCalister and his wife and the family, remember me kindly affectionately and bear in mind that by Christmas I will try and write more of my Indian boy John. Now for yourself and your family accept my love and best wishes...and answer. All well...with much respect and love, your old cousin,

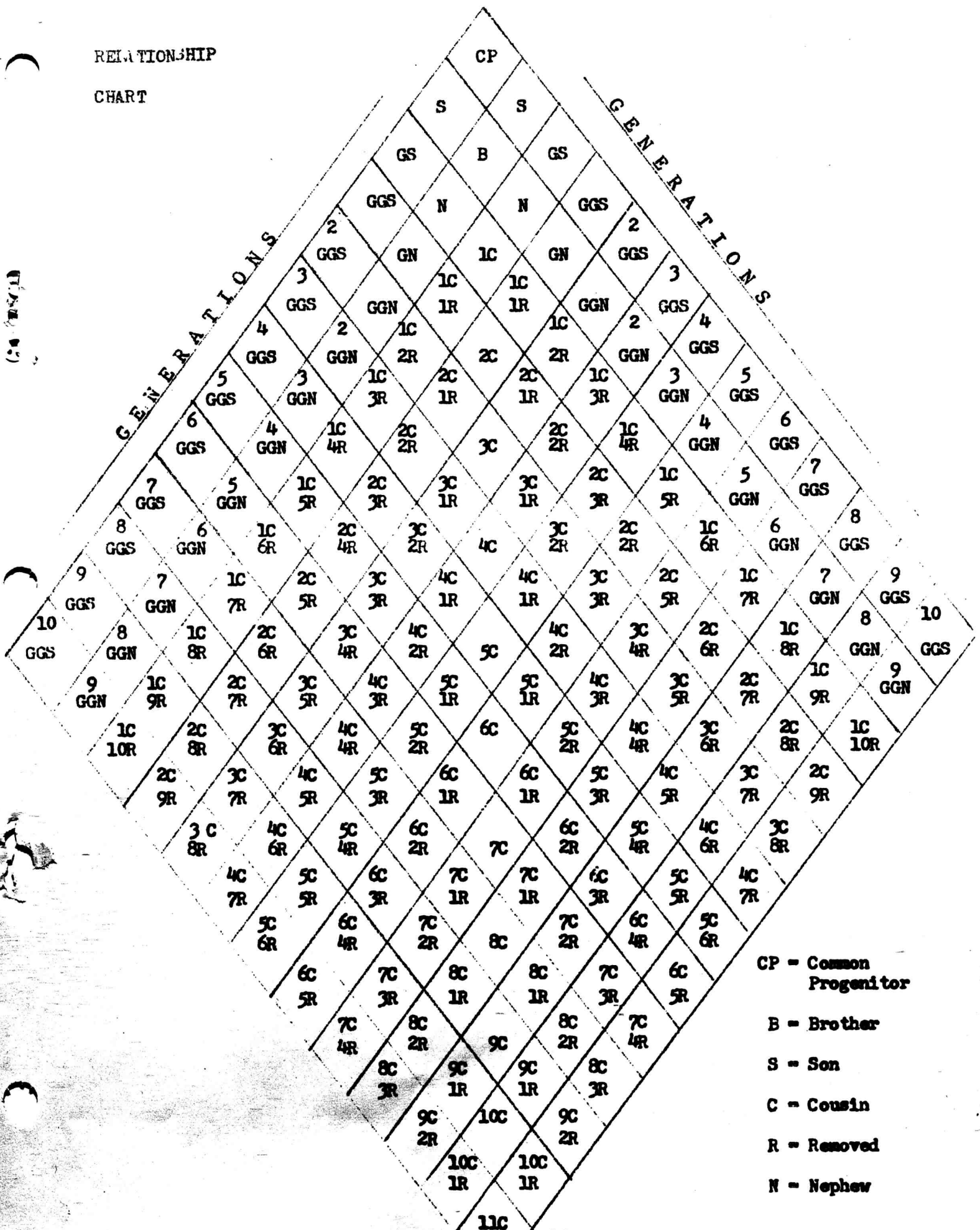
