PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Genealogical Society of Siskiyou County, California, Inc. is nonpolitical, non-sectarian and incorporated by the State of California as a non-profit educational organization.

In existence for just one year, the Society was formed in 1972 by local interested people concerned with preserving the history of Siskiyou County from the most accurate source--the written records of its people. Over seventy family members have joined, a family being a husband and wife and all children yet living at home. During this year, the Society published four issues of its quarterly Bulletin entirely with volunteer help. This Bulletin is devoted to publishing the early marriage, death, cemetery, census, great register of voters, etc. records of Siskiyou County in a form easily accessible to anyone. It attempts to show a true accurate picture of the history of the County for students or for any interested people.

Headstone inscriptions from all cemeteries in the County have been recorded and the Society expects to publish them in book form in the near future so that these valuable records may be at the disposal of genealogists everywhere. These include the following cemeteries: Davis, Hen* ley-Hornbrook, Yreka City(commonly called Butcher Hill now), Saint Joseph's Catholic, Evergreen, Little Shasta, Mount Hebron-Macdoel, Etna, Happy Camp, Fort Jones, Fort Goff and Hamburg.

The Society can be proud of the record of its accomplishments of the first year and of the sincere and unselfed efforts of those members who are working to compile, collect and preserve the heritage of Sisa kiyou County, which in turn draws its heritage from all corners of the earth.

A special debt of gratitude is owed the officers who guided the group during the first year--President Andrew B. Van Hooser, Vice President R. Marie Neimoyer, Corresponding Secretary Kathleen Gloyne, Recording Secretary and Press Chairman Wilogene Simpson, Treasurer Vada Letcher, Editor Caraway George and Librarian Bernita Tickmer. Thanks to Barry Barnes for instructing the "Historical Genealogy" class through College of the Siskiyous organized by the Society.

Well! Our newest member, Glenda Nadine Whipple, made her debut 2 September 1973 at Rogue Valley Memorial Hospital, Medford. Of course, no one was happier than Mom and Dad, Peggy and Neil Whipple, of Etna, and a somewhat bewildered sixteen-month-old brother, Monte Warren.

Glenda and Monte are the sixth generation of Whipples to live in the Scott Valley area. Number one was Michael S. Whipple and his wife Helen (Eastlick) who homesteaded in Oro Fino in 1887. With them from Illinois came several children, one being W. Wallace Whipple and his wife Ida (Burke). They too homesteaded in Greenview, raising three girls and a son G. Earl. Earl lived in Scott Valley since childhood, and married Annie Miller whose ancestors, the Wilsons and Walkers, had settled in Oro Fino and Scott Valley in 1863. Earl and Annie raised six children--the fourth generation--the oldest being Glemm M. Whipple of Quartz Valley, Glenda's grandfather.

Glenda's grandmother, Sara Sue Whipple, also comes from a pioneer family. Her father, Robert Burton, comes from a large family raised in Quarts Valley. Burtons still live on the ranch, and take cattle into the mountains. Sara's mother, Gladys (Jones), lived in Mugginsville where her grandparents, Joseph Jones and Asa Howard, settled in 1852. Asa's house is still being used today. This makes Glenda and Monte the sixth generation on their grandmother's side, too. So you can see, in a little over a hundred and twenty years, Glenda has quite a family heritage to be proud of.

In naming Glenda, which means "Valley," and Monte, which means "from the mountains," we hope we have instilled in them a love and closeness to Scott Valley and the people here, much as have their parents and ancestors before them.

MADDOX LETTER, shared with us by Benjamin A. Maddox, R.1 Box 308F, Montague, Ca.

This old letter was found by the Mormons. I received it from C. J. Maxwell, the man that wrote the Bonniefield History. I had been told enough about Matthew Maddox, the old Revolutionary War soldier, and Alphaeus Maddox, my grandfather, by Israel, my father, to know that this letter tells of the origin of my family. It was written in 1848 by Matthew Maddox, brother of Alphaeus.

When a person begins to write he must have some place to begin. Therefore as I am about to write the origin of my family, I shall begin at the first settlement of Virginia in 1607. Christopher Newport landed in South Virginia with 105 persons and commensed the first settlement where Jamestown now stands on the James River. Newport returned to England and brought over 120 settlers in the year of 1609. There were five hundred immigrants that came over in the year of 1611. Lord Deleware sailed to America and with him sailed: Applebay Maddox, and a Scotchman by the name of McGruder, which I shall say more about hereafter. In the year of 1620, there were 90 young women sent over. And in 1621 there were 60 more sent over. These women were sold to the planters for wives. The first sale was 100 pounds of tobacco. The next sale was 150 pounds of tobacco, selling at 3 schillings per pound. In 1625 the Indians broke in on the colonies and killed 300 men women and children.

I shall now go back to Applebay Maddox and the Scotchman that I have above mentioned who were both Romans and became associates on account of their religion. Applebay Maddox was the first Maddox that ever set foot on American soil. It has been handed down from generation to generation that he and the Scotchman were verry stout men, and when Indians broke in on the colonies, that those two men kept possession of one of the houses and fought with no other weapons than clubs. It is said they killed five Indians, as they went to enter the door and wounded a good many more and put others to flight.

After this Maddox went on an exploring expedition up the Appomattox River and undertook to make a settlement on a piece of land that pleased him and the Indians came across him and killed him, the Appomattox River took its name from Applebay Mattox, though there is a difference in spelling the name of Maddox.

The Appo came from the Scotch Language. For a short name the people called him Appo Mattox, but nearly every stranger to the name of Maddox spells it Mattox or Matticks. It appear as that when Applebay Maddox was killed he had a wife and she was in a state of pregnancy and brought forth a son soon after his death, and she died also, and this young babe was nursed and raised in a Roman family and when he came to the years of maturity, he married and had three sons: Charles, John, and James. Charles settled in North Carolina and raised 16 children by two wives and their generations are scattered through seven or eight of the wastern and southern states. I saw one of them in the state of Missouri. He told me that he was the fourth generation from Charles Maddox that I have mentioned above. He gave me the best account of the origin of my family that I ever had, and he told me that his brother had in his possession in Carolina an old Roman bible that was brought from England by Applebay Maddox and it had many ancient records of the family in it and Applebays birth amongst the rest, but the name of the little orphant, Applebays son, was lost, his father being killed before his birth and his mother dying soon afterwards, his name never was placed on record in the old Bible in the West Stock Carolinas. Charles was the fourth generation that has been born in America: I now go back to John Maddox, the brother of Charles and James. He settled in Maryland on the Cheasapeak Bay, and lived a bachelor all his days and accumulated a fortune, and outlived his brothers, and before his death he willed his estate to his brothers children, which my grandfather was one those hirs and I have seen my Grandfathers will and have a copy of it and in his will he willed and bequeaths all his part of his Uncle John Maddox's estate to his children to be equally divided among them when recovered from Henderson, the administrator.

I now go back to James Meddox, the youngest son. of the orphant that I have before mentioned. He was my father's grandfather and married and settled in Saint Marys county in the state of Maryland, and raised two children a son

and a daughter. The sons name was John, who was my grandfather, the daughter's name is not known to me. Her father died and her mother married again to a man by the name of Tilden and moved to the coast and was never heard of afterwards.

My grandfather was born and raised in the state of Maryland in Saint Marys County on Rock Creek, and married a woman by the name of Dyson, and they lived in peace and happiness togather for 60 years. They raised 7 children and lived to see them all married and settled. Their names was as follows: Samuel, Notley, Thomas, John, Mary, Sary, and Matthew, Samuel Maddox settled in Maryland and raised 4 children. Notley settled in Virginia, Culpepper County, and married Susanne Bunch and they raised seven children Jessie, Samuel, Notley Benjamin, Susanna, Mary and Sary. Thomas moved to Kentucky in an early day and the number of his children is not known to me but I think 4 was the number. John Maddox was killed at Washingtons Fort Necessity, somewhere near Pittsburg. Mary married a man by Craulley they raised one child only. Sarry married Thomas Conn of Culpepper County of Virginia afterwards moved to Kentucky, Burbonn County. They raised 4 children: Notley, Thomas James, and John, William, Sary and Cassie. The branches of the family that are yet alive live in Burbonn County and are wealthy. Natthew Maddox the youngest child of my grandfather, which is my father and retained the same name, and am of the 5th generation from Applebay Maddex, that has been born in America. My father Matthew Maddox, was born and raised in Saint Marys County in Maryland, and married Rachel Bennifield of the same place. And in the time of the Revolutionary war he moved to the state of Virginia and settled on a branch of the Rappohannek River called the Sandy Hook, And soon after his removal out there came an 18 months draft and he was taken in that draft to march forth with, under General Green, to the south as the British was running over the south at that time. This fatel affair proved the ruining of my father. I could go into a lengthy detail here that would be interesting but I make short work of it as possible. My father fought in seven hand battles and at the general battle between

General Green and Lord Cornwallis, he was wounded and carried off the ground by a man by the name of Cissen and left in the woods and remained five days and nights without food or water, only the dew that he got off the grass. At length he was taken up by those that came to bury the dead. Cisen was tried for leaving him in the woods and received 100 lashes. This Cisen I have seen myself. My father was taken to the hospital and his wounds examined. He was shot through the leg with an ounce ball. His leg was split open on both sides and the small bone of his leg taken out from one joint to the other. He had other wounds which caused him to be opened twenty years after the war. I saw the operation performed by Doctor Williams of Clarksburg in Harrison County, Va, a considerable portion of his bowels was taken out and laid on a cloth by his side. He raised head and locked at them and observed that he had seen his own guts. When the remedy was applied they were returned back, and he got well and was tolerable hearty for twenty odd years before his death. He is now gone the way of all the earth. He was a peaceable quiet man, kind to his family, obliging to his neighbors, and I believe to all who knew him, never got in a passion except he was verry much aggrevated, but when raised to a passion his spirit was great. He feared nothing that could come before him. I have seen him twice in a passion he would be sick for several days afterwards, and his temper runs in the family, hard to offend and hard to appease. My parents raised 10 children, 8 of them their own and 2 were adopted orphan children. Their names were as follows: Darcus, Mary, Rossel, Matthew, who is the writer of this work, William, Thomas, Arnold, and Alphaeus. Two adopted children's names was Elizabeth, and Tracencal. The oldest of my fathers children is 76 years of age, and the youngest fifty four, and the eldest of the adopted children fifty three, and they are all alive. There is now living 64 grandchildren of my parents, and 115 great grandchildren and & children of the great great grandchildren, now at this date June 1848.

I now go back to McGruder as I have promised to say more about him. From him sprang a brave set of men. My informent was my uncle Samuel Bonnifield

who died last fall, 1847, in his 97th year. He was in the battle of Fort Pleasent and well known to these circumstances. He told me that when Washington went out with Braddock that he chose three of those McGruders to go weth him and they were all killed, and that some of the stock resided in Georgetown in Maryland. There was three of them that came under my knowledge. Two of them by the name of Nathanel, and the other was called Wade. Two of them held the office of Tobacco inspectors for life. This is all the account that I can give as of the Scotchman.

I will now give some account of my mothers family. My grandfather was Grogery Bonnifield. They were French Huguenots. They lived north of the heas of the Oise River in France and emigrated to Scotland. From there they sailed to North America in 1728 and settled in Maryland. He was born and raised in Frederick County Maryland and married Sary Henley, of the same place and raised 11 children, 7 daughters 4 sons Samuel, Arnold, Henry, William, Mary, Bachel which was my mother, Barsheba, a twin sister to my mother, Elizabeth, Patsey, Sara, Darcis, Samuel married Darcus James, he raised 7 children and only one living at this time. He was a man of strong mind, never forgot anything that he had understood, He was a citizen of Randolph County for sixty years. He twice acted as Sherif of that county. He served as Magistrate till the sheriff's place to to him. He died in his 97th year, and gave me a great deal of instruction concerning our encestors. Arnold Bonnifield the next brother died in Louisiana. William Bonnifield yet living in his 80°s. Mary Bonnifield married Thomas Benton, Barsheba married W. Marsters, and moved to Carolina, Sary married Henry Hane, moved to New Madrid, Rachel married Matthew Maddox, Elizabeth married W Beggelan, Patsy married Wm Tripplets, Darcus married Edward Tracewell. Those Bonnifields was a dark skinned people. Straight black hair large brigded noses long narrow faces with large brown eyes and generally tall, very stout men to lift but not verry active, peaceable, good citizens and very industrious fargers. I must say something about ay grandmothers family. Her name was Wesley Sara Henley.

she was Jewish desent. I can't say much about her family as they were not numerous in America. I have saw two of her nephews, Daniel and Joshua Henley. She was born and raised in Maryland. She lived to be 96 years of age, her brother Tele Henly, lived to be 101 years, and I often heard her say that her father lived to be 101. Her oldest son lived almost 97 years, her second son 85. This is the best account that I can give of the origin of my family and if there is any other that can do better, let him do so.

There were three of the Bonniefield family mentioned in this letter in Siskiyou County in an early day. W. B. Bonnifield started the first private school in Yreka in 1855, and in 1856 the state took over and started the first public school. W. B., Samuel and Ellis Bonnifield found gold on Pine Street, and started the first United States Bank this side of the Mississippi. You will find the story of the Bonnifields in a book called <u>THE SADDLEBAGS</u> by Jones in the Siskiyou Library, pages 40 and 140. TYPHOID FEVER--Last week the family of L. Bills, of Scott Valley, near Rough & Ready, and that of Mr. Cramer at the same house, were bereft of five children, the former losing two, and the latter losing three, from the effects of typhoid fever, all of the children being under 8 years of age. Other children in the above families are also afflicted, and doubts are entertained of their recovery.

DIED--At French Creek, Scott Valley of typhoid fever, the following named children of George L. and Emma Cramer: Sylvester Judd Cramer, died Nov. 5th. aged 6 years, 2 months and 7 days.
