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Notes of Clara Millie (Hovey) Russell of her brother's death, contributed by Blanche Doggett Heflin, her granddaughter. Eugene Hovey was the son of William Ashley Hovey and Mary Caroline Wallace who were pioneers in the early 1850's.

During the Modoc War, the Government was hiring men with teams to haul supplies to the battle front, and Eugene Hovey wanted to go. His mother pleaded with him not to go. He said, "Mother, I will get \$8.00 a day and board; I can pay Mr. Orr for these horses. They had just bought a big pair of gray horses for \$300.00. This was just after their second house had burned and the third one built.

A Mr. Sam Buckmaster who lived with them, had left, before the war started, to go to Warm Springs near Alturas. On the way, he was stopped and sent back by the Indians who said to "tell Pale Face, Indians fighting soldiers."

Eugene Hovey was to haul freight - not to work on the battle field, but the officers detailed him and another man having two horses, to carry in the wounded and dead. It was not his day on detail, for he and Sam Buckmaster were out the day before, but the man who was to go claimed he was sick, so he and Buckmaster were sent the second day. While on the round, Buckmaster was walking and Eugene riding one horse, and either he or Buckmaster was leading the other horse. All at once the Indians started firing from a bluff, and Buckmaster said, "Eugene, jump and run under the bluff." He saw Eugene's horse's head drop, but Eugene never answered. Buckmaster was fired at while running to the bluff, but was not hit. This was his third escape. When he got to camp he told what had happened. The sick man was the first to volunteer to go with his horses. He was accompanied by a squad of soldiers. They took the body to camp and made a coffin for it, then brought it to Yreka. When word reached Yreka that the soldiers were bringing the body in, a party of 22 young men from Yreka went to meet the body. The body was so badly mutilated that it was never shown. The horse Eugene had been riding was killed, but the second horse was never found.

As for this monument, a few years ago a man came to the house and asked, "Is this Russell's?" I answered, "Yes." He said, "Is Mrs. Russell here? I want to see her." I told him to come in. Mrs. Russell, upon hearing him, started to the door. He met her and said, "Are you Eugene Hovey's sister?" She said, "Yes." It made her feel faint and she sat down. He pulled up a chair and sat just in front of her, and said, "What do you know or remember about his death? How old were you then?" She answered, "Twelve years old. I was in school. The teacher told me I could take my books and go home. I did not know why

I was sent home, but as I turned the corner by the convent, two men passed and one said, "Yes, Eugene Hovey was killed." It seemed my heart stopped. I leaned against the fence. When I got home the house was full of people and they had put mother to bed and would not let me to in. Then the doctor came out and said, "She will be all right soon." The next thing I heard was that Pete (we never did know his last name) took papa in his horse and buggy and went after Eugene's body. Then word came that the soldiers were bringing him in. Then a body of 22 young Yreka boys went to meet the body.

This man who was with some society who was planning on putting up a stone at the spot where Eugene was killed, asked if I would help. I said "Yes. I will furnish it and put it up." He said, "Oh, we only want a small stone." I took him to the shop where he saw a small piece of rock that was broken off. He said, "Here, this will do." He took his pencil and tried to write on it; it was too slick. He told me the wording they wanted, and it would fill a good sized stone if lettered good. At last he settled on a Hickey marker 16 inches long and 8 inches wide. He said he couldn't carry it as it was too thick. I tried to show him a slant face was better than the Hickey marker, but he thought it would be blown off. But at last he agreed to send me the lettering and let me know which style of stone they wanted, and when they wanted to set it. But I never heard from him again, and the next thing we knew, Mrs. Russell saw in the paper where they had set Eugene's stone already.

And this is why you've got what you have here.

The young men of Yreka had a monument set up at Eugene's grave in Yreka. It reads: "Erected to the memory of Eugene Hovey, killed at Lava Beds by Modocs, April 17, 1873; aged 21 years, 2 months, 22 days. I have but one ambition and that is for Father and Mother."

Just after the third Hovey home was burned, 12 years later, the Government paid Papa Hovey \$350.00, which was less than half his claim for his horses, wagon, and the salary due Eugene at the time of his death. This was all Papa Hovey had to build his fourth house with on the same property.

Eugene Hovey, son of William Ashley Hovey and Mary Caroline Wallace, was born Jan. 30, 1852 in Center, Lafayette County, Wisconsin. He was killed April 17, 1873 in the Modoc War 30 miles from Yreka.

He is buried in the Evergreen Cemetery, Yreka, Siskiyou County, California.

EXPLANATION OF EVERGREEN CEMETERY MAPS

THE FOLLOWING MAPS OF EVERGREEN CEMETERY (IN YREKA, SISKIY OU COUNTY, CALIFORNIA) HAVE BEEN PRINTED IN SECTIONS, WITH EACH SECTION BEING NUMBERED. ONE STONE IN EACH SECTION SERVES AS A LAND MARK TO LOCATE A CERTAI N PLOT OR GRAVE. THERE IS NO OTH ER REASON FOR TH E SELECTION OF THIS STONE, AND IT DOES NOT RELATE IN ANY WAY TO TH E OTHER PEOPLE BURIED IN THAT PLOT.

THE CEMETERY IS OVER 16 ACRES IN SIZE AND CONTAINS MANY UNMARKED GRAVES. SOME OF THE STONES HAVE WORN AWAY UNTIL THEY ARE UNREADABLE.

COMPI LATION OF THIS RECORD HAS TAKEN TIME AND WAS ALL VOLUNTEER WORK. IF ANYTHING H AS BEEN LEFT OUT OR NAMES MIS- SPELLED IT HAS NOT BEEN THE INTENTION OF ANYONE.

NO NAMES ARE LISTED IN THIS RECORD UNLESS THERE IS PROOF AS OF A STONE OR A READABLE MARKER.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS RECORD IS TO LIST AS MANY NAMES AS POSSIBLE OF PEOPLE WHO WERE BURIED IN THE EARLY DAYS, BEFORE RECORDS WERE KEPT IN TH E COU RT HOUSE OR IN TH E VITAL STATISTICS IN SACRAMENTO, WHICH BEGAN ABOUT 1907 FOR SOME COUNTIES.

THIS RECORD WAS COMPLETED IN MARCH OF 1973 BY LOUISE AND CARAWAY GEORGE, AND THERE ARE NO LATER BURIALS, UNLESS SOME ONE WAS RECHECKING, AND FOUND A NEW GRAVE NEARBY. TYPING WAS DONE BY EDNA KANKAS.
