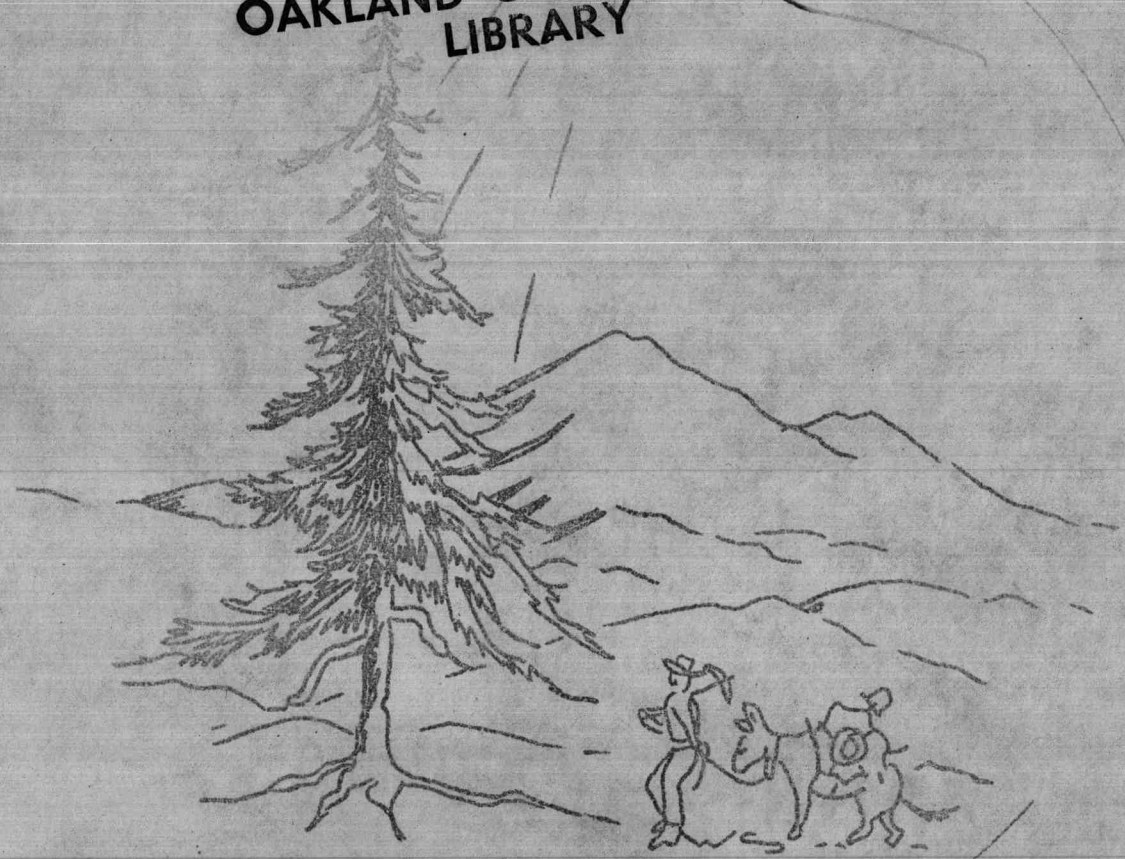

Declaration for Cemetry

(Copy of the original deed was submitted by Caraway George.
Wording and spelling are the same as in the original document.)

Inasmuch as it is a custom arising from a principle of common humanity among all nations and people to respect places of Sepulture; and whereas it has been the immemorial usage of the Israelites, in whatever land they have dwelt to set apart, enclose, and carefully preserve from waste and neglect such places as are consecrated to the burial of their kindred and people: Therefore be it known that we Henry Goldsmith, Frank Livingston and Anson Goldsmith of the City of Yreka, in the county of Siskiyou, and the state of California, acting in behalf of the community of Israelites within the county aforesaid, have selected and apportioned to the public and vacant common adjacent to the present Cemetery of said City in said County, the following described parcel of land to be enclosed, used and designated, as a cemetery of their people: to wit, said parcel of land begins at a stake standing about one hundred feet north of the limits of the said common cemetery of said City and about three hundred feet east of the county road leading from the said City of Yreka, through Shasta Valley to the Territory of Oregon, and runs thence east one hundred feet to a stake thence north fifty six feet to a stake, thence west one hundred feet to a stake, thence south fifty six feet to a stake.

In testimony of this public declaration and notice we hereunto set our hands this 12th day of February A D 1857.

On this the 12th day of February A D 1857 personally came before me E. M. Anthony, a Justice of the Peace within and for the said county Henry Goldsmith Frank Livingston and Amson Goldsmith known to me to be the persons described in and who executed the foregoing instrument who acknowledged to me severally that they executed the same freely and voluntarily and for the uses and purposes herein mentiones. Given under my hand at Yreka this twelvth day of February 1857.

James Quigley was another pioneer settler of Chester, Mass. who located near the Holland farm, and not very far from the Worthington line. He was born in Stranorlar, County Donegal, Ireland, near Londonderry, near the head of Lough Swilly. The family had suffered from dissensions of the times, and members of it had seen active service during the siege of Derry by James the Second.

The Quigley family did not long remain in Chester, the sons of James selling out the homestead and removing to Oswego, New York. James Quigley first mentioned, first landed at Boston, where he married Isabella Walker, whose father was in the Colonial revenue service. Mr. Quigley, after his marriage, which his namesake characterizes as a "runaway match", located in Worcester, a about a mile from the court house, where he remained until well advanced in years when for some reason he sold his property and removed to the rugged hills of Chester.

Mr. Samuel Quigley in his interesting sketches, says that after the old gentleman had cleared and erected his buildings, and paid for everything, he had half-bushel measure full of Spanish milled dollars left. He was generous in his contribution to the Church and charitable purposes, and was a valuable citizen. He and his consort rest in the cemetery in Chester.

One of his sons, John Quigley (3) was a member of the company which under the auspices of Gen. Rufus Putnam, Gen. Arthur St. Clair and other prominent leaders made the first permanent settlement in the region now covered by the flourishing state of Ohio at Marietta, situated at the mouth of the Muskingum River on the 7 day of April, 1788. His father-in-law, Col. Oliver, accompanied him. Here he amassed a handsome property.

Another son remained in Worcester after the removal of his father to Chester, and was among the first to enlist in the American Army at the outbreak of the Revolution. At the battle of Long Island in August 1776, he became separated from his command, but dodging the British troops, he reached the banks of the East River, which he finally swam with three muskets--which he had picked up on the battlefield--lashed to his back, and joined the army under Washington, and was present at the Battle of White Plains the next October. He served through the war and was present at the surrender of Yorktown, Virginia in October 1781.

Another son, Hugh Quigley, married Mary, the daughter of James Holland and from him are descended the Quigleys of Chester.

PLACE NAMES IN SISKIYOU COUNTY

Place names in Siskiyou County, some of which are now in what is known as Modoc County, were excerpted by Edna Kankas from "California Place Names" compiled by Erwin Gudde, printed by University of California Press, Berkeley and Los Angeles, 1949.

BUCKEYE Named after a town in Ohio by residents from Ohio, State nickname.

CALLAHAN Named for M. B. Callahan, who built a cabin at the foot of Mt. Bolivar in 1851 and opened a hotel there in 1852.

CECILVILLE The place was named for John Sissel, who came to Shasta Valley sometime before 1849, the name was misspelled when the Post Office was established in 1870's.

CLAWHAMMER BAR In '54 there came to Hardscrabble on the 4th of July a stranger attired in a clawhammer coat and plug hat to attend the celebration. He had plenty of Dust and good spirit, but alas, coat and hat were destroyed by the wild happy crowd, but the incident added the name Clawhammer Bar to one of the richest spots on the Salmon.

COPCO Coined from the name CALIFORNIA OREGON POWER COMPANY, 1915.

CRAIGY PEAK The peak was given this name, a Scottish spelling variant of Craggy, because of its rugged appearance.

DORRIS Named after Presley and Carlos Dorris, brothers who were stock raisers in Little Shasta Valley in the 1860's.

DUNSMUIR The Southern Pacific reached this section in August of 1886. When Alexander Dunsmuir, a "coal baron" of British Columbia and San Francisco passed through Cedar Flat, a station consisting of a boxcar, he promised the settlers a fountain if they would name the future town for him. This was accepted and at the beginning of Jan. 1887, the name and the boxcar were moved to the present site, which had been called Pusher. The fountain still stands at the railroad station.

MOUNT EDDY Named for Nelson Eddy, a native of New York, who

arrived in 1857 with one yoke of oxen and one cow, lived alone on the slope of the mountain until 1867, then became a successful rancher in Shasta Valley. The Wintu Indian name of the peak was *lu-tai-be-lo-sas-pom*, west blaze mountain.

EYEBE CREEK The name of the affluent of the Klamath is derived from that of the Karok Indian village "Ayis" at the mouth of the creek.

FORKS OF SALMON So named when the post office was established in 1859 because of its situation at the confluence of the North and South Forks of the Salmon River. A place called Salmon is shown on Eddy's map (1854) not here, but at the junction of the East Fork and the main stream.

GAZELLE The name of a small African antelope was given to the post office in 1870; many places have been named for the native antelope. In the 1850's a steamer Gazelle plied between San Francisco and the upper Sacramento River.

FORT JONES The fort was established on October 16, 1852 by Companies A and E, First Dragoons, named for Colonel Jones. The garrison evacuated the post on June 23, 1858, but in 1860 the settlers of Wheelock renamed their settlement Fort Jones in gratitude for the military protection they had received. In 1862 the name was adopted for the post office until then called "ttitiewa" for the Scott Valley branch of the Shasta Indians.

GOOSE NEST More than fifty geographic features in the state, Goose Nest in Siskiyou was named for the presence of this bird which was important as food for the travelers in the early days. Goose Lake now in Modoc county, that sheet of water that is now only a lake bed, was probably the one called Pit Lake in 1832 after Pit River.

KLAMATH RIVER The settlement called Klamath River was first called HONOLULU, then (until 1934) GOTTVILLE, for William H. Gott.

KLAMATHON In 1890 James McLaughlin built a mill here and called it POKAGAMA, an Indian name which he had brought from Wisconsin. When John Cook ran the mill in 1892 he renamed it KLAMATHON, the name of the river plus the suffix. The name POKAGAMA was then applied to the logging camp near SHOVEL CREEK SPRINGS.

A petition for Better Protection of Game, filed April 7, 1890 by A. H. Burrows, clerk. Submitted by Forrest R. Simpson.

A petition to the Hon. Board of Supervisors of Siskiyou. We the undersigned, members of the Callahan Sportsman's Club and others, would respectfully represent: that we desire to arrest the wanton slaughter and extermination of our game species, which is immanent; but that we think and fear that our best efforts will amount to nothing while an old law, entitled "an act for the protection of game in Siskiyou County (approved April 2, 1866, Stat. Cal 1865-6, p 855, is in force.

It is wholly inadequate to protect the game for the close season is far to short and the penalty to small, the latter should be both by fine and imprisonment and so heavy as to deter lawless persons from breaking the law. Elk, Mountain sheep, Antelope and female deer and fawns should be exempt from killing altogether, and the possession of unlawful game or parts thereof, and hides of deer that do not show evidence of the genital organs of the male deer or buck, should subject to the same penalties as the killing.

In view of the facts herein above set forth, we, your petitioners do most earnestly and respectfully pray your Honorable body to repeal the above quoted law and to pass an ordinance in lieu thereof that will meet the wants in the case; and your Petitioners will ever pray as in duty bound, etc.

GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY OF SISKIYOU COUNTY

PURPOSE

To stimulate public interest in family history, to collect, preserve and publish genealogical, biographical and historical matters relating to American families and places; to provide educational service to the communities in Siskiyou County, California; to establish and maintain for the use of members and others a library of American genealogy, local history and biography, including a surname file; to hold meetings for the instruction and increased effectiveness of its members; and to serve and support the genealogy departments of Siskiyou County Public Library.

POLICIES

1. This Society shall be non-profit, non-political and non-sectarian.
2. This Society is not affiliated with any other organization, but will help, share, and exchange genealogical information.

MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Open to all individuals, libraries and societies by application for membership on a yearly basis, who are interested in promoting the purpose of the Society.
- Section 2. Members joining before July 1, 1972 shall be Charter Members.
- Section 3. Membership in this organization shall consist of two classes: Subscribing and Active.
- Section 4. Subscribing Members shall be limited to all genealogical, historical and other organizations and libraries which exchange publications for the Society Quarterly, or which subscribe to the Society Quarterly for their files at the current rate.

ARTICLE I

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of the five elected officers and the appointed officers.
- Section 2. A quorum shall consist of at least four Board members.
- Section 3. The Board of Directors shall hold a meeting prior to the Monthly meeting of the Society.
- Section 4. The Board shall submit reports at the regular meetings of the Society.

Section 5. The Board shall approve any form set up by the Society.

Section 6. The Board shall appoint an Auditing Committee to audit the accounts of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE II

OFFICERS

Section 1. The elected officers shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.

Section 2. Appointed officers shall be a Librarian, Press Chairman and Editor.

Section 3. Elected officers may also hold an appointive office.

ARTICLE III

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The PRESIDENT shall preside at all meetings as Chairman of the Board of Directors; appoint officers as in Article II, Section 2; appoint committee chairmen, and serve on all committees when necessary; call special meetings of the Board of Directors; and fill vacancies in offices by appointment, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. Either he or the Vice President shall countersign all checks with the Treasurer.

Section 2. The VICE PRESIDENT shall preside in the absence of the President; assume other duties of the President in his absence; serve as Program Chairman, and appoint other chairmen as are necessary to carry out his duties.

Section 3. The TREASURER shall have custody of all funds of the Society; keep accurate books of account; keep a record of members in good standing; shall pay out funds as authorized by the Board of Directors; shall present a statement of account at every meeting of the Society and such other times as requested by the Board of Directors; and shall make a complete financial statement for the Annual Meeting. He shall countersign all checks. The Treasurer's report shall be audited annually. Each month's Treasurer's report shall be filed for audit after each meeting.

Section 4. The SECRETARY shall keep the minutes of all business meetings; shall read at each meeting the minutes of the previous meeting; shall keep the Constitution of the Society up to date; make all changes voted on by the membership; shall receive and attend to all correspondence; shall be responsible for the mailing of notices and/or publication of the Society.

Section 5. An office shall be declared vacant when the officer has been absent without adequate reason from four consecutive meetings.

Section 6. The Librarian shall be responsible for cataloging and indexing all books and periodicals acquired by the Society; shall maintain Vital Statistics Clipping Scrapbook, and maintain a record of accessibility. The Librarian may appoint assistants, if needed.

Section 7. The Press Chairman shall represent the Society in the newspaper, radio and television publications; shall maintain a scrapbook, and prepare an annual report of the Society's activities.

Section 8. The Editor shall be responsible for the correctness of any genealogical publication that the Society undertakes.

Section 9. The Auditor shall chair a committee to audit the books annually, and present the report to the Board of Directors.

Section 10. The Subsidiary Coordinators shall represent the subsidiary clubs to the Society; shall report subsidiary club activities to the Board of Directors and/or Society, and oversee the management of their subsidiaries.

ARTICLE IV

ELECTIONS

Section 1. An annual election of officers shall be held.

Section 2. The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee three months prior to the election meeting; this committee is to choose a slate of candidates to be presented two months prior to the election meeting. Nominations from the floor will be heard at the election meeting. The Nominating Committee shall serve as an Election Board to conduct the voting.

Section 3. Officers shall be elected at the regular May meeting, and installed at the June meeting.

Section 4. Election shall be by ballot; however, if there is only one candidate for any office, on motion from the floor, election may be by voice vote.

Section 5. A vacancy occurring in an office shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V

MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held once each month, the last Friday night, except in November and December, which meetings shall be combined to meet on the first Friday in December.

Section 2. Additional meetings may be held at the discretion of the Board of Directors, or at the request of 10% of the membership, upon due notice to all Active Members.

ARTICLE VI

DUES

Section 1. Dues shall be paid annually, and are due July 1.

Section 2. The dues shall be \$5.00 each, or per married couple and children at the same address.

Section 3. If in arrears on dues, delinquent members will be notified at four months, and dropped from membership rolls after six months delinquency.

Section 4. Delinquent members shall not receive the Society's publication until dues are received.

ARTICLE VIII

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a regular meeting, providing the amendment has been proposed in writing at the previous meeting.

STANDING RULES

I. SUBSIDIARY CLUBS

Subsidiary clubs are sub-organizations of the Society, made up of members of the Society, with special interests and/or goals in accordance with the Charter and Purpose of the Society. Each subsidiary club shall appoint a Coordinator who shall be a liason between the Society and subsidiary, per Article III, Section 10.

A. Subsidiary Club No. 1: FIRST FAMILIES OF THE PACIFIC STATES

- a. Purpose: To collect, preserve and publish genealogical, biographical and historical matters relating to ancestors of members with particular lineage, in accordance with the purpose of the Society.
- b. Eligibility for Membership: 1) Membership in Society, 2) Ancestor must have lived in the area of the present States of California, Oregon and/or Washington in 1870 or at a prior date.
- c. Applicant must furnish proof of lineage.
- d. Dues: \$2.00 per year, due July 1, payable to Society's Treasurer.
