Published by the students of the Siskiyou County High School,
Yreka, California.

In a little hut on the Forest House mountain is living to-day the oldest inhabitant of Siskiyou county. While she was a grandmother, the Modoc tribe occupied the upper Klamath, Goose Nest, and beyond to the east, while the lower Klamath, Shasta River and Valley, and Scott Valley were claimed by the Klamath tribe, who were less warlike than the Modocs. To this former tribe belongs the subject of our story.

Moons ago, before the white man came here, Peggy's husband and tribesmen fought with bows and arrows against the Modoc tribe and thus, early in life, Peggy saw the horrors of warfare. When the whites first came, they placed their rockers and sluices on the flats where Yreka now stands. The mines paid well, people flocked to them, and Yreka, from a mere group of scattered tents, grew rapidly to a town. In those early days the Indians harassed the whites frequently, and it was on one of these occasions that Peggy proved herself the strong friend of the pale faces.

Her tribe had planned a night attack against Yreka. On learning of this, like a flash there came to her mind all the kindness of her white friends, and she resolved to warn them. At night quietly she stole from the camp, hurried twenty miles to Yreka, told the dread news, and returned to her wigwam, her absence not having been noticed. The attack, as planned, was to be at night, and torch and tomahawk were to spread terror and destruction through the little town. So the day before the intended attack the Indians sent out scouts to see whether everything was clear, but, to their surprise and chagrin, they found sentinels posted and the whites armed and ready to receive them.

The attack was abandoned and Peggy, though a traitor to her tribe, proved a savior to the people of Yreka. Not long after this, the Klamaths scattered and soon ceased to be a tribe. The Modocs made their last fight at the Lava Beds in the '70's, and the few survivors are now living in the Indian Territory. But Peggy, with a few of her relatives and friends, took up her abode about two miles south of Yreka, and ever since, for many years, she was a daily visitor at the homes of her white friends and never was she sent away empty handed. About six years ago her visits became less frequent, and recently she suffered a stroke of paralysis that rendered her perfectly helpless. Yet, though old and feeble, and no longer able to care for herself, her white friends of Siskiyou have not forgotten old Peggy, their early friend and savior. The County gives her a monthly allowance that suffices for her comforts in her declining years.

Her age we can only guess. The old settlers say she was at least sixty years old at the time of the first settlement in 1851. At any rate, our pensioner, the oldest but as deserving as any, Peggy, will soon pass to the happy hunting-grounds, where the palefaces and the red men shall meet and smoke the pipe of peace together.
